Originally called the Cheddar Young People's Millennium Trust, the trust was established in 2000 to help the young people of Cheddar aged 5 to 25 years with their education and personal goals in areas such as music, theatre, the arts and sport.

The trust makes grants available to applicants, helping them develop their talents, interests and learning, encouraging them to take on leadership roles and to give service in communities at home and abroad.

The Cheddar Youth Trust raises funds and invests those funds, using the interest earned to support young people in Cheddar.

The trust's objective is to grow its investments to the point where it can provide substantial support to Cheddar young people for perpetuity.
